



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Paris Agreement - Status of Ratification.

195 Parties out of 198 Parties to the Convention are Parties to the Paris Agreement.

On 5 October 2016, the threshold for the entry into force of the Paris Agreement was achieved.

The Paris Agreement entered into force on 4 November 2016, thirty days after the date on which at least 55 Parties to the Convention accounting in total for at least an estimated 55 % of the total global greenhouse gas emissions have deposited their instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession with the Depositary.

Authoritative information on the **status of the Paris Agreement**, including information on signatories to the Agreement, ratification and entry into force, is provided by the Deposite rythrough the United Nations Treaty Collection website, which can be accessed here, and the Depositary Notifications which are available here.



MESTI's mandate as the authorization entity is included in the part 4 of the Framework and Article 13 of the Ghana-Switzerland Bilateral Agreement in pursuit of Article 6 Paragraph 1 of the Paris Agreement. The framework and the bilateral agreement also incorporate the authorization procedures for Ghana.

Regular Information

The Information to be included in the BTR consists of:

- 1. How a Party is fulfilling the participation responsibilities
- 2. Updates to the information provided in its initial report
- 3. Authorizations for the use of ITMOs
- 4. How the selected corresponding adjustments ensure that double counting is avoided, are representative of progress towards implementation and achievement of the country's NDC, and do not lead to a net increase in emissions
- 5. How the country has ensured that the selected ITMOs will not be further transferred, further cancelled or otherwise used
- 6. How each cooperative approach in which the country participates contributes to the mitigation of GHGs and the implementation of its NDC, and ensure environment integrity

Required Information for BTR

The Modalities, Procedures and Guidelines of the ETF specify the content of the BTR and cover detailed guidelines on:

- National Circumstances and institutional arrangement
- National Inventory Report
- Description of NDC and any updates; target and description, target year or period, reference point (base year), scope and coverage, and use of cooperative approaches
- Information necessary to track progress made in implementing and achieving the NDC; mitigation policies and measures, including those with mitigation co-benefits resulting from adaptation actions
- Information related to climate change impacts and adaptation
- Information on financial support, technology development and transfer as well as capacity building support needed and received or provided and mobilized
- How flexibility options are chosen (constraints or improvement?)
