Climate and Energy Ministers' Meeting,
together with the declaration of the G7
Principles of High Integrity Carbon
Markets.

The Center has a global remit to promote these principles through capacity-building — helping to develop the know-how, institutional arrangements, and international links needed to leverage Article 6.

High Integrity Carbon

High integrity carbon markets must be consistent with ambitious, science-aligned emissions pathways, to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.

✓ Supply-Side Integrity:

MRV + high environmental integrity


✓ Demand-Side Integrity:


The use and disclosure of credits must align with net-zero emissions by 2050

Based on the decisions on the detailed rules for implementing Article 6 at COP27, establish thematic working groups (WG) of (1) authorization, (2) reporting, and (3) tracking, necessary for the implementation of Article 6, and provide support for capacity building (CB) and institutional arrangements, mainly targeting government officials.



A6IP at COP28 – Launch of Support Package

Launched Article 6 Support Package to further enhance NDCs towards the 1.5 degree target. Participation by Minister of Ministry of the Environment Japan, Minister for Climate Change, New Zealand, other high level participants from Bangladesh, Singapore, the US, UNFCCC Secretariat, World Bank, and International Emissions Trading Association.



Invited acquiring countries (Switzerland), host countries (West Africa, Nigeria) and organizations (GGGI, IETA, UNU, etc.) involved in Article 6 implementation to discuss directions for effective implementation of capacity building.


