








Third plenary meeting of the Paris agreement Article 6 Partnership

March 19th, 2024

Tunisia National Determined contribution


- Tunisia is a party of Paris agreement and was among the pioneers who submitted an NDC on september 16, 2015 and updated it on october 2021.
- Increased ambition: reduction in carbon intensity by 45% (instead of 41%) in 2030 compared to 2010.
- Unconditionnal emissions reduction: 27% by 2030/2010,
- Conditionnal emissions reductions: 18 % in 2030/2010



- Implementing the updated NDC requires mobilizing significant financial resources, estimated at approximately US\$19.4 billion from 2021-2030. These include US\$14.4 billion for mitigation.
- 82 % of the financing needs stem from the energy sector (particularly capital intensive sector).
- International support to be mobilized in order to fulfil conditional contribution would amount to 11,1 Billion/USD over (2021-2030),
- This support could be mobilized in different forms (concessional credits, grants, carbon market mechanisms,,,)
- Tunisia wishes to engage in the cooperative approaches in all sources eligible for article 6 mechanisms and more particularly in renewable energy field, but also industrial processes, waste and waste water, agriculture, forestry and land use.

Tunisia's Art.6 Strategy

- A vision towards Art. 6 was prepared with the support of the GIZ and adopted by April 2023,
- is structured around 7 points:
- 1. Promote the use of Article 6 (capacity building for key players, financial support framework for projects, negotiating bilateral agreements...)
- 2. Implement transparent regulations for emission reduction ownership
- 3. Transparent indication of sources/activities which emission reduction might be marketed through Art. 6 (relevant criteria relating to eligible projects and eligible national entities),
 - 4. Withholding Mechanisms
- 5. Use of Withholdings (options regarding the use of the withholdings: recycled into mitigation policies, provisions against the risk of non achievement of the unconditional objective..)
 - 6. Fiscal treatment of ITMOs' revenues
 - 7. Promotes the emergence of voluntary Market



- Bilateral agreements signed under article 6 to date:
 - A Mémorandum of cooperation signed with Japan uneder the JCM (Joint crediting Mechanism): August 2022.
 - A bilateral agreement signed with Switzerland : december 2023 at COP 28.
