



- Authorization under Article 6.2 and key elements in Article 6 guidance relating to authorization
- Key consideration on authorization
- Compilation of authorization frameworks by various countries (with access links)
- Examples of authorization process, criteria and content of an authorization statement, based on recent practices

Key consideration for authorization

The CB tools identify the steps and key consideration for putting in place authorization arrangements drawing from experience and practices.

| 1 | Determine the scope of use of Article 6 |

- How the authorization ensures that the mitigation activity contributions to the implementation of the country's NDC
- How the authorization ensures that the transfer of mitigation outcomes will not undermine the country's ability to achieve its own NDC
- □ How the authorization addresses elements required for Article 6 reporting, including on, among others, environmental integrity and sustainable development

Implementation of authorization

Depending on a different country's context, authorization arrangements may be implemented through legal, policy and/or procedural instruments/types of documents based on the national legal system, delegation of powers, and other national contexts.
